Concisely written with a clean, easy to read layout and format.


Require time, effort, and extensive review of your background for effective results.



Resume

Brief, concise document that presents, and effectively demonstrates, your most relevant and positive credentials.

Typically used for obtaining positions in business or industry.



A more extensive document that presents academic and professional credentials.

Typically used by graduate students who are applying for academic or teaching research positions.

Resume is Used for:

Positions in business and industry

Supplement to application materials for Awards, grants or fellowships

Admission to graduate school Other professional purposes

CV is used for:

- -Admission to graduate school
- -Grant proposals
- -Application to teaching, research, and higher level administration positions in higher education
- -Publishing and editorial review boards
- -Research and consulting positions

Length varies

- -One to three pages for masters degree candidates
- -Two to five pages for doctoral degree candidates
- Five or more pages for experienced academician or researcher

Main advice on length

Focus with relevant information in a readable format
